Sharing the Light Events

Sharing the light begins, of course, at Easter Day, when we celebrate the Risen Christ and light the Easter Candle – a sign of God's light and love for the world.

In the days after Easter we've special events to encourage sharing the light.

On Saturday May 6th we've a Wine and Cheese evening at Church with a short film, and opportunity to meet and discuss, Paul Pritchard invites Gay and Lesbian Christians and friends to this evening.

Informal Eastertime celebration for all ages at St Chrysostom's School on Sunday 7th May at 3pm. Fr Ian leads a relaxed and friendly afternoon with craft activity, opportunity to meet, and refreshments.

On May 13th we are going on our 10th day pilgrimage to Ladyewell, and encouraging lots to attend, and bring a friend. More details below.

Fr Chris is leading an **afternoon for the elderly at Richmond Court on the afternoon of Friday 19**th **May**. It will include singing, with visiting singers, a short fun quiz, and refreshments as well as lots of time to meet and chat.

On May 21st we've an informal **meeting of Christians and Muslims together** as we share food, and talk about our common ground and how together we can share light for our world. The meeting is at St

John's School at 3pm and will be led by Fr Ian, Sandra Palmer and Gareth Elswood (Head teacher).

Our **Young Adults are having a get together** on May 25th on Ascension Day – for a party, with food and hopefully fireworks. Hannah and Sarah are the hosts for this gathering.

On Sunday 28th May **Open Table** invites its friends and supporters for a *Sharing the Light* service followed by a meal together in Church. Fr Chris and Alan Beck will be the hosts for this.

On Saturday June 17th women of our church and their friends gather for a Chocolate evening organised by Mtr Kim and Hannah.

Our Sharing the Light events lead towards a special Sharing the Light event at Church with Bishop Mark on Sunday 25th June at 6pm EVERYONE is encouraged to attend.

Each of our events will be friendly and welcoming and we encourage people to come along with friends or family. At each event there will be opportunity to discuss how we can share light for our world, and how we can encourage the message St Chrysostom's offers to our community and people.

As well as these special events for differing peoples others are planned - some are small events one or two are larger ones.

Our Sharing the Light initiative will be supported by prayer. During Easter week, Monday to Friday 17th to 21st April prayers will be said for our church and its people, that we may be 'Easter People,' sharing God's light. The Rosary Group on 28th April and 26th May, at 5.30pm will pray the Luminous Mysteries. And we are asking Sr Jean and Sr Linfa and the sisters at the CHN Convent to support us in prayer too.

SUNDAY WORSHIP

Parish Mass at 11am

Sunday Mass is our main act of worship and we invite all to attend and be a part, week by week. If for some reason you can't make a Sunday then there is, of course weekday worship.

Vespers at 5pm each Sunday. Led by a variety of people this is a quiet, reflective act of worship.

Weekday worship:

5pm Monday to Friday,

Vespers on Monday and Friday and Mass, Tuesday to Thursday.

Open Table, is a welcoming inclusive service (often a Mass) for all people. Everyone is welcome and there is a special welcome to LGBT people. It is held at 5pm on the last Sunday of each month and is followed by refreshments.

Open Table will be on Sunday 30th April, 28th May and 25th June (main Sharing the Light event) all at 5pm.

Church is usually open Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons from 2pm to the end of 5pm worship.

St Chrysostoms Church welcomes new people. Anyone is welcome to volunteer to read at worship, to serve at the altar or to help in other ways at worship and in church work. Simply speak to one of the priests or say 'Yes!' if asked!

EASTER CHAPEL

During the 50 days of Easter we transform the Anson Chapel into an Easter Chapel and encourage people to visit and reflect and pray about Easter. Classes from St Chrysostom's School will visit during Eastertide and we will have special events and times of prayer there too. Fr Julian has created a lovely Easter garden, Hannah has worked on some simple prayer activities, people can leave prayer requests there and they will be offered in worship. The chapel will be open from Easter Day. Do visit.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LADYEWELL: Saturday May 13th

This year will be the tenth joint St Chrysostom's / St Peter's Oughtrington pilgrimage to Ladyewell, and to celebrate that it's going to be a special one. Bishop Mark will be leading. We're inviting everyone along. Let's make it a 'grand day out'! We leave church, by coach at 9.30am and we'll be back for 5pm. Bring a packed lunch. Coach fare £5 for adults, children free. Sign up in Church to come.

MAY - Mary's month

May is a special month when we honour Mary, the Mother of Jesus. We're refurbishing, a little, the area around Our Lady's statue in Church, and this will be rededicated on May 27th by Bishop Mark.

As usual during May Our Lady's statue will be crowned, and the crowning ceremony will take place with some children from St Chrysostom's School on Wednesday 3rd May at 11am.

Fr Chris will be inviting us to say the Angelus daily in May, either once or morning, noon and evening, each day. We look for volunteers to 'cover' each day. Sign up in Church.

MAY - and Mary's meals

Mary's meals is a fantastic charity raising money to give children school dinners in needy countries of our world. Knowing their children will be fed parents send them to school, thus helping them receive a good education. This is a simple solution to an area of world poverty.

As usual we're raising money for Mary's meals this May, and involving the local community. This year Mary's Meals tell us 40p given to Mary's Meals gives a child school dinners for a week in the developing areas which Mary's Meals serves.

At Church events to support Mary's Meals include a collecting pot at Our Lady's statue throughout May, a sponsored 1k or 2k run or walk (!), in Birchfields Park at 1pm on May 21st. And more adventurous runners are inviting sponsorship for running in the BUPA Manchester Run on May 28th, full details of how to sponsor closer to the date.

Look out too for a schools and church quiz evening in May, raising money for Mary's meals.

Sharing the Light – among ourselves at Church

As part of our Sharing the Light plans we are encouraging people at Church to get to know one another a little better. One way we are doing this is to update the photos on our church noticeboard. These help us put names to faces. In addition we are encouraging people to take part in worship — many do — and others could. So if you are asked to be a welcome, or to bring up bread and wine, or help in other ways do please say yes!

On one or two Sundays we will be inviting people to have a name badge with their firt name on it. This, we find, is a great way to find out the names of people.

On Pentecost Sunday we're going to have a special presentation in place of the sermon which will help us to see how God the Holy Spirit is at work among us and in our area. This is a special way of recognizing God at work among us.

Come to Church!

To help get top know one another, and to build up our faith its good to come to church week by week. This helps us build up our fellowship at Church and also means we are there to worship and pray, as well as to encourage new people among us. Think about it! Will you commit to being at 11am Mass each week whenever you possibly can?
